KEY ISSUES AND OBJECTIVES TO WHICH LEGRAND CONTRIBUTES

Infrastructure investments

11.1 By 2030, ensure access for all to adequate, safe and affordable housing and basic services and upgrade slums

11.2 By 2030, provide access to safe, affordable, accessible and sustainable transport systems for all, improving road safety, notably by expanding public transport, with special attention to the needs of those in vulnerable situations, women, children, persons with disabilities and older persons

11.5 By 2030, significantly reduce the number of deaths and the number of people affected and substantially decrease the direct economic losses relative to global gross domestic product caused by disasters, including water-related disasters, with a focus on protecting the poor and people in vulnerable situations

Legrand has forged partnerships with associations that work on a daily basis to improve the homes of vulnerable people. For example, in the United States, Legrand, through its "Better Communites" program, partners with "Habitat for Humanity", "Building Homes for Heroes" and "Rebuilding Together" to help veteran families, low-income families and people with disabilities to improve their living conditions. In France, the "Compagnons Bâtisseurs" association, which works with families in financial difficulty to improve their housing, develop local self-help networks and promote integration through economic activity in the construction sector is supported by Legrand through the Legrand Foundation.

Sustainable buildings

In 2021, following on from the agreement signed in 2017, Legrand has renewed its commitment to Electriciens sans frontières and the Crisis and Support Center (CDCS) of the French Ministry of Europe and Foreign Affairs for the management of humanitarian emergency situations. Material and financial resources donated by the signatory partners of this agreement are mobilized for this purpose in order to reduce the number of people affected by natural disasters or emergency crises.
